O - "How should I know? Dammit Jim, I'm a Doctor not an ornithologist!"

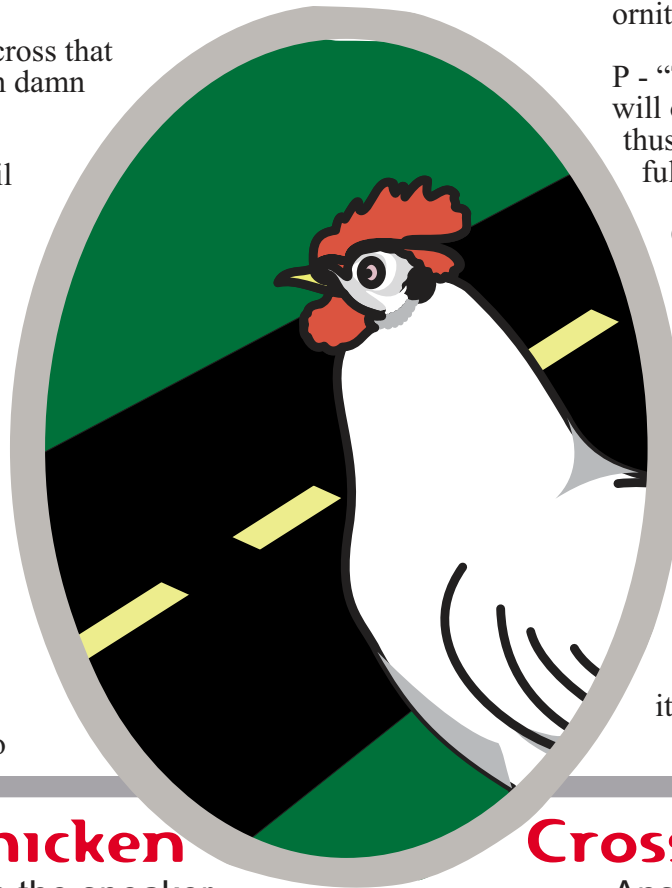
P - "The chicken acted against the will of Allah the merciful, who thus smote it with an Airstream full of pilgrims to Milwaukee."
